Who We Are.

A non-profit service agency that provides resources, support and technical assistance to neighborhood groups throughout Erie County. We offer regular training opportunities and workshops; notification of funding opportunities and assistance with funding applications; research and distribution of best practice information; education on services available to neighborhood residents; connections to key community partners, i.e. law enforcement, code enforcement, social service agencies, faithbased organizations and schools; provision of technical assistance at individual neighborhood group meetings.

What We Do.

Since June 2014 the NRO has accomplished the following:

- Held a series of informational workshops, based on feedback from residents on what topics are of most interest to them, on topics such as Combating Drugs, How the Justice System Works, Capacity Building, Grant Writing and Home Security and Situational Awareness.
- Produced a number of publications, including a Neighborhood Safety Toolkit, Grant Writers Handbook and an Organizer's Handbook for Neighborhood Coordinators.
- Awarded 29 Neighborhood Mini-Grants to assist neighborhood groups with carrying out projects and activities that they determined would have a positive effect on their community.
- Sponsored the first-ever Good Neighbor Awards to recognize individuals, groups and businesses that have demonstrated a commitment to making their community a better place to live
- Launched a new website (nroerie.org) to share information with a wider audience.
- Established relationships with an ever-increasing number of community partners to coordinate efforts, work toward common goals and develop comprehensive strategies for revitalizing neighborhoods.
- Increased the number of our neighborhood group partners from 11 to more than 25, while extending our services to a growing number of communities such as Corry, Wattsburg, McKean and Millcreek.

Neighborhood Resource Organization

The NRO is a component of Unified Erie, a county-wide violence reduction initiative that employs a three-prong approach of Prevention, Enforcement and Reentry to address the root causes of problem behaviors. In 2012 Unified Erie developed a clear plan with proven strategies for preventing crime, known as the Erie County Community Action Plan (CAP). This comprehensive plan is backed by data and fully supported by law enforcement at the local, state and federal levels. The NRO was created in June 2014 to implement strategies identified in the CAP to reclaim our neighborhoods and improve the quality of life for our fellow residents.

Over the past 2 years the Neighborhood Resource Organization (NRO) has had a tremendous impact on the well-being of neighborhoods and communities in Erie County by working directly with neighborhood groups and residents that are committed to reducing crime and improving the quality of life in their communities.

However, we are now at a critical point where we need the support of the community to continue our efforts. The initial grant funding that got us up and running is winding down and we are facing the very real possibility of reducing services and staff at a time when we are just beginning to hit our stride. **Please consider a donation to the NRO so that we can continue to provide training, technical assistance and resources to neighborhoods in Erie County.**

JULY 2015

The NRO executive director was a guest presenter for the first Community Awareness Forum hosted by the Crime Victim Center.

Announced the first annual Good Neighbor Awards to recognize individuals and organizations making positive impacts in their communities and celebrate their accomplishments.

Produced our third handbook, The Organizer's Handbook for Neighborhood Coordinators.

Hosted first annual Good Neighbor Awards Ceremony in December 2015 recognizing 11 individuals, groups and businesses nominated by the community for their work in their neighborhood.
